
Canadian corporate bond new issuance totalled about \$79 billion year to date (a 28% increase from prior year to date). The Bank of Canada did not buy any corporate bonds during the month of July as the market was risk on and investors were gravitating towards yield that put corporate bonds in demand. The yield curve moved lower between 1bp to 12bps. Most corporate spreads tightened in 3bp to 26bps during the month. The bond universe returned 127bps while the corporate bond index returned 185bps. Canadian High Yield returned 177bps. The Fund performed well from Mattamy, Superior Plus, Millar Western, First National and Tidewater bonds, offset marginally by our hedges in Canada bonds and our bonds in Chorus Aviation, MCAP Commercial LP and Tricon Residential.


